Does my family qualify to live in the Riverside Court Housing Cooperative?

If your family meets any of these conditions, you may be eligible:

- You have children under 18 living with you
- Your family's total annual income is less than \$30,000
- Your family is willing to help maintain the cooperative's property
- Your family is living in a shelter or unsafe housing.

You can fill out an application at one of the community meetings listed below.

How do I apply?

You can apply at any of these community meetings:

How do you select candidates?

Our Riverside Court Board will evaluate your application once we receive it. We'll assign it points based on the conditions listed above.

We will award available spaces to the families with the most points.

Hundreds of low-income families across the region need affordable accommodation. The Riverside Court Housing Cooperative is a community-based venture that offers low-cost housing to needy families. Are you and your family candidates to live in the Riverside Court Housing Cooperative? If you satisfy one or more of the following four criteria, you may be eligible for subsidized housing. Do you have children under 18 living with you? Is your total annual family income less than \$30,000? Is your family willing to contribute to the cooperative by helping to maintain the property? Is your family now living in a shelter or unsafe housing? If you and your family meet one or more of these criteria, you can apply by filling out a form at one of the community meetings noted below.

Once we receive your application, the Riverside Court Board will evaluate it according to the criteria noted above. Assigning points based on these criteria, the Board will award any available spots to those families with the most points. You must apply at one of four community meetings that will be held throughout the year. The first meeting is on 1 March at Meadowglenn Community Centre at 7:30 p.m. The second is on 1 June at the Marvin Hopswiller Community Centre at 8:00 p.m. The third is on 1 September at 7:30 p.m. at Meadowglenn. The fourth is on 1 December at 6:30 p.m. at Meadowglenn. These meetings will also be advertised in the city section of the local newspaper.
